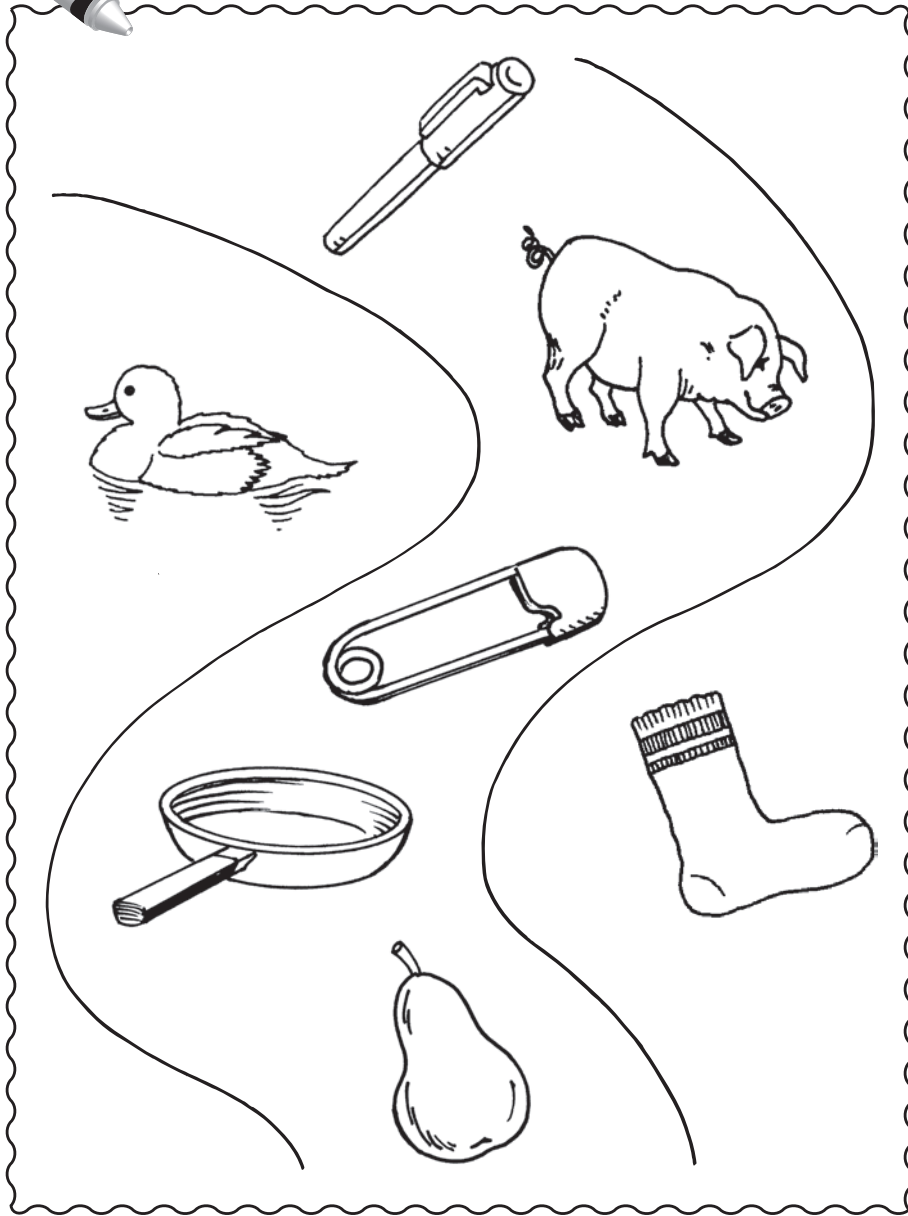

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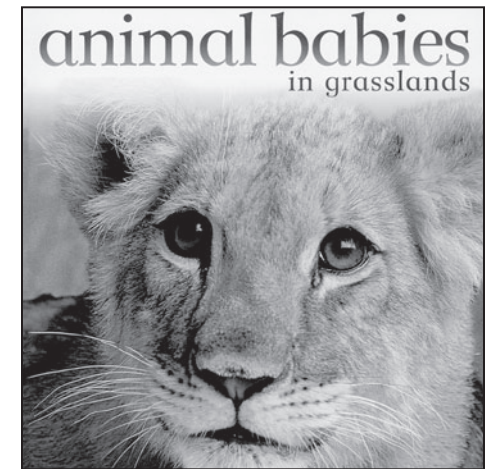

Talking About Grassland Animals

Learning About /p/ Spelled Pp
Main Idea

Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

Day 1 **Read Together**

Have your child choose a book. Look for words that begin with /p/. Repeat the words together.

Day 2 **Read Together**

Have your child read Decodable Story *Pat the Cat*. Find /p/ words.

Day 3 **/p/ Spelled Pp**

Review the words that begin with /p/. Then read the following sentences to your child. Have your child clap every time /p/ is heard: *I am Pam. My cat Pat likes people. The pig put pencils in the pen.*

Day 4 **Adjectives for Colors and Shapes**

Collect various items, such as a book, a pencil, and markers. Ask your child to describe the items, such as *square* book, *long* pencil, and *yellow* markers. Tell your child that adjectives are used to describe things.

Day 5 **Practice Handwriting**

Have your child add the letters *s*, *p*, and *m* to the word parts to form words.
