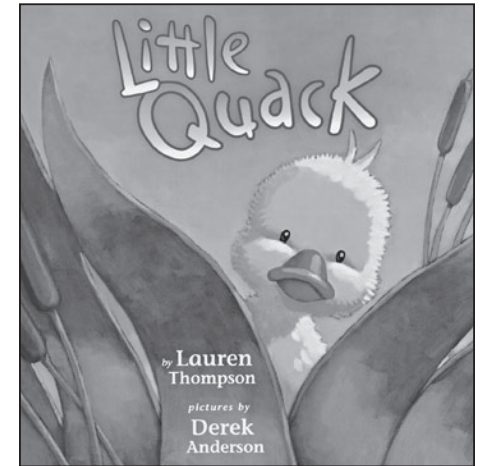

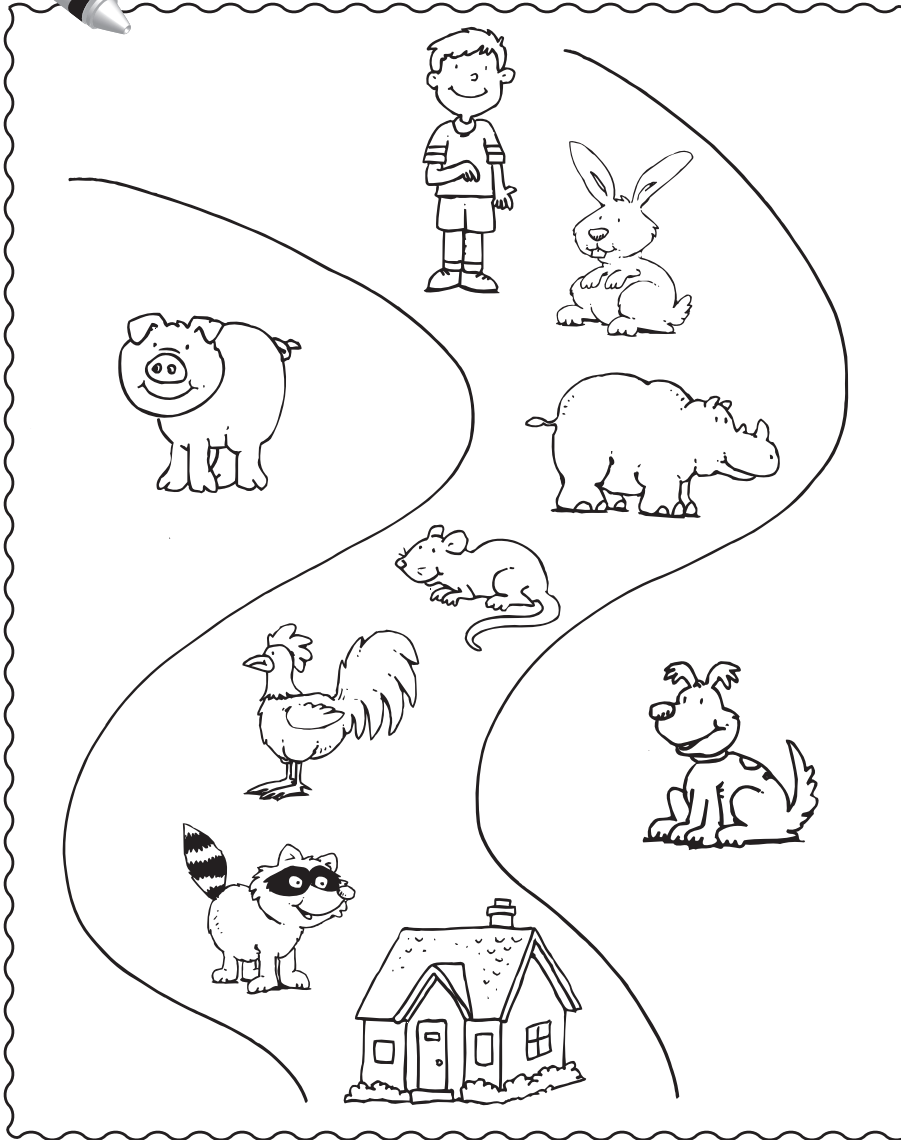

Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

**Day 1** **Read Together**

Read the following sentence to your child: *I like to run and read.* Ask your child to name the /r/ words in the sentence. Continue with this sentence: *I like to ride and rake.*

**Day 2** **Read Together**

Have your child read Decodable Story *Rin the Rat.* Find /r/ words.

**Day 3** **/r/ Spelled Rr**

Have your child name the /r/ words on the Help Ron activity. Then have him or her replace the first letter of each word below with the letter *r* to make a new word.

**Day 4** **Verbs for Now and the Past**

Have your child tell you what he or she did at school today. Point out that the action words are called verbs. Have your child use verbs to tell about things done now and things done in the past. Give examples, such as *walk* and *walked*, *look* and *looked*.

**Day 5** **Practice Handwriting**

Have your child copy the sentence below. Tell your child that *ran* and *race* are /r/ words. Also, remind your child that *ran* is a verb.
